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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BIB120 New Testament Literature (3) A survey of New Testament literature stressing the major features and genre of each book. Special attention is also given to the theology, historical context, and background of each book.

BIB201 Psalms (3) Prerequisite: BIB110, BIB120, BIB220; The course will combine a study of some of the broader issues of the Book of Psalms such as the history of interpretation, the Hebrew poetry, the Psalter as a collection, and the use of the Psalms in worship with exegetical study of individual psalms.

BIB350 Kingdom of God in the Testaments (3) Prerequisite: BIB110, BIB120, BIB220; An exploration of the historical, theological, and ethical significance of the Kingdom of God within the Old and New Testament. Topics focus on the biblical witnesses to the kingdom, the mission and message of Jesus, the role of the people of God, and the ongoing significance of the kingdom for society and the church's mission.

THE124 Pentecostal Theology (3) This course introduces the student on the tenets of the Assemblies of God. Emphasis is placed on the foundation of Pentecostalism, an examination of the four cardinal doctrines of the Assemblies of God such as the role and work of the Spirit in relation to baptism, salvation, healing, and the second coming of Christ.

THE256 Theological Ethics for Christian Leaders (3) This course is a study of ethics from a theological and biblical perspective. It provides the foundation for ethical analysis of modern and moral challenges at the personal and public level of life. Topics covered include the study of virtue, deontology, teleology and utilitarianism.

THE340 Introduction to Mission Theology (3) Prerequisite: THE103, THE124, THE256; This course introduces the student to the concept of the Mission of God as expressed through the perspective of the larger evangelical/Pentecostal tradition. Focus will be on reading the Biblical text, and thinking theologically, from the perception of God's missional intentions. This course will advocate for a reading of the Bible that sees God's mission unfolding under his providence and will stress the role his people have in this mission. Special emphasis is placed on the contextual aspect of Mission Theology.

MIN120 Practicum II: Personal Ministerial Development (1) Practicum courses are designed to serve as an opportunity to learn the essentials of ministry and integrate academic learning with practical ministry experience. Students are required to put in practice their learnings by serving in a church, ministry, or organization. Topics covered for this course include the spiritual practices, developing personal character and integrity as a minister, dealing with people in ministry through conflict management and problem-solving skills, and the professional responsibilities of the minister with family life, social life, and spiritual life.

MIN130 Practicum III: Personal Ministerial Development (1) Practicum III focuses on learning how to implement the ordinances and rites of the church. Topics covered in this course include: How to baptize, marry, bury, administer Communion, altar prayer, laying on hands, praying for the sick, healing, and deliverance.

MIN218 Gender, Leadership, and the Church (3) This course intends to introduce the student to the necessity of overcoming the gender discrimination and inequality that occurs within ministry and leadership. Various issues, problems, challenges, and social complexities that revolve around the different gender roles within the church and leadership are addressed.

MIN251 Biblical Theology of Worship and Prayer in Children's Ministry (3) This course establishes the theological and biblical foundations for worship and prayer within children's ministry. Students explore key Old and New Testament themes, examining how Scripture shapes a theology of worship and prayer appropriate for children. Emphasis is placed on understanding God's design for worship, the role of the Spirit in childlike faith, and how to guide children toward authentic encounters with God. *(online only)*

MIN400 Cross Cultural Ministry (3) Prerequisite: MIN110, MIN120, MIN130, MIN199; This course seeks to expose students to the models of cross-cultural ministry. Students will learn how to minister in multi-cultural settings, understand cultural boundaries, learn how to communicate the gospel in diverse settings, and appreciate the value of cross-cultural ministry.

HIS202 Church History (3) A survey of the major theological controversies, persons, and writings of church history from the New Testament to the Reformation. *(online only)*

MAT163 Math and Personal Financial Management (3) An introduction to algebra for financial arithmetic and an introduction to consumer math that will aid the student's financial life. Topics included within this course are accounting principles, taxing, simple and compound interest, investments, and credit cards.



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ACC221 Managerial Accounting (3) Prerequisites: BUS122, ACC220; A study of accounting principles pertaining to partnerships and corporations. Payroll and some tax issues will also be discussed. Introduction to manufacturing and cost accounting is included. *(online only)*

MNG400 Organizational Behavior and Management (3) Prerequisites: MNG110, BUS111; An examination of organizational behavior, principles of leadership and their application to group settings. Emphasis will be placed on organization and work design, goal setting, reward systems, managing change, theories of motivation, role of power, and decision-making. *(online only)*

STA300 Introduction to Statistics (3) Prerequisite: MAT163 or other college math course; This course is an introduction to techniques for the treatment of data in the social and behavioral sciences, business, and education. Among the topics discussed are frequency distributions, percentiles, measures of central tendency, variability, the normal curve function and probability, simple correlation analysis, and some application of sampling theory. Also discussed is the use of the t-statistic as well as an introduction to Analysis of Variance models. *(online only)*

PSY210 Child Growth and Development (3) Prerequisite: PSY101; This course presents the study of human development from conception through adolescence. Special emphasis is placed upon the theory and application of the principles of cognitive and moral development, social and emotional development, and physical development. Additionally, students will examine individual differences and other variables such as ethnicity and culture as they impact development during the formative years. *(online only)*

PSY320 Human Sexuality (3) Prerequisite: PSY101; This course is a comprehensive study of human sexuality from biological, social, psychological, moral, and ethical perspectives. The course is developmentally and topically oriented, beginning with the origins of and influences on sexuality in childhood and culminating with a study of aging and sexuality. *(online only)*

CERTIFICATE in MINISTERIAL STUDIES COURSE DESCRIPTIONS *(online only)*

BIB103 Old Testament Survey (1 unit) [First 8 weeks of the semester]

A survey of the Old Testament stressing the major features of each book and emphasizing the practical value of these books in our modern world. Special attention is also given to the content, chronology, and historical background of each book.

BIB125 Introduction to Hermeneutics (1 unit) [Second 8 weeks of the semester]

An introductory study of the science and rules of biblical exegesis and interpretation. This course establishes the principles and methods by which the correct meaning of the Scriptures may be obtained.

THE222 Theology I (2 units) [All 16 weeks of the semester]

A study of the methodology and content of systematic theology. Theology proper, anthropology, and bibliology are examined in this course.
